## 2010 FEATURED SPEAKERS

### Steve Alford

University of New Mexico

Certainly Steve Alford is no stranger to Indiana basketball fans. He had an outstanding high school career at New Castle High School and was named Indiana "Mr. Basketball" in 1983. While at Indiana University he was a three-time all Big 10 selection, twice an All American (1987, 1988) and captain of Bobby Knight's 1987 NCAA National Championship team.

Steve Alford began his coaching career at Indiana's Manchester College, going 78-29 in four years and leading his team to a Division III National title match-up in 1995. Another four-year stint followed at Missouri Valley powerhouse Southwest Missouri: now Missouri State—where he compiled four winning seasons and a cumulative 78-48 record plus a pair of post season bids.

The former Olympian and one-time NBA pro with Dallas and Golden State was named the University of Iowa head coach in 1999. He led the Hawkeyes to the NCAA the very next year and to five consecutive post season berths thereafter. He completed an eight year stint at Iowa with a 152-106 record.

In two short years at New Mexico where he landed in 2007, He's made the Lobos a distinct threat to all comers and brought new thrills to the infamous "Pit" in Albuquerque. In 2007-2008 his team tied the record for most wins by a Lobo coach in his first season, winning 24 of 33 games. During his 17 year coaching career his teams have averaged 20.6 wins and in early February 2010 were hot on the trail of another 20+ wins and perhaps their first conference championship in 15 years. Welcome home Steve!



### Tricia Cullop

University of Toledo

Coach Cullop is a native of Bicknell Indiana and is a former Indiana All Star and Purdue Boilermaker. In the mid 1990's Cullop left the state of Indiana after three productive years on Purdue's NCAA teams coached by Linn Dunn. She began her coaching career at Radford and then coached at both Long Beach State and Xavier before becoming the head coach at the University of Evansville for the past eight years. During the 2007-2008 season, while leading the Purple Aces, she was Co-Coach of the Year. Coach Cullop became the head coach at Toledo in April 2008. Her first team got off to an unexpectedly strong 18-13 season and Cullop earned MAC Conference Co-Coach of the Year Honors. This season Toledo is 15-4 in late January as this newsletter goes to press.



### Rodney Watson

University of Southern Indiana

Coach Watson is a native of Paris, Illinois. He began his career at Coulterville (IL) High School and won the schools' first ever regional title. He then moved to Madison High School (IL) and had even greater success. Watson entered the collegiate ranks at Nebraska-Omaha in 1986 before becoming the assistant coach at Southern Illinois University. During his tenure at SIU, the Salukis won 11 Missouri Valley Conference titles and qualified for nine NCAA and six NIT tournaments. In May 2009, Watson became the head coach at the University of Southern Indiana and as of late January 2010, the Screaming Eagles were undefeated and nationally ranked.



### Dana Altman

Creighton University

During Dana Altman's 16 years at Creighton University, 20 win seasons have become commonplace. After moving from Kansas State in 1994, where he compiled a 68-54 record and secured three post season tourney bids, he's had 11 straight 20 win seasons during the past 15 years including seven NCAA and five NIT appearances.

Dana earned all-conference honors as a quarterback in football and as a guard in basketball at Wilber High School in Nebraska. He began his journey in the coaching ranks as an assistant at Western State in Gunnison, Colorado. He then briefly and very successfully (29-6) served as head coach at Southeast Jr. College and another three highly successful years at Moberly (MO) Junior College where his record was 94-18. He spent three years at Kansas State as an assistant then moved across the country to become the head coach at Marshall University. He became the head coach at Creighton for the 1994-95 season. During his 15 years at Creighton he has led the Blue Jays to a 309-160 record. Altman is among the few coaches to be chosen Coach of the Year in three different conferences including the Southern Conference 1990, the Big 8 in 1993 and the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2001 and 2002.



### Spencer Wood

Icebox Athlete

For the past 10 years, Spencer Wood has traveled the globe as an author, teacher and speaker on mental skills and toughness training. He has spoken at events such as the 2010 American Baseball Coaches Convention, the 2005, 2006 & 2008 NCAA Final Four, the 2010 Nike Football Coach of the Year Awards and the NCAA Champs/Life Skills Program. Some notable programs that Icebox has recently worked with also include international and U. S. Olympic coaching conferences including SEC, CAA and Big East. Spencer Wood's articles have appeared in publications such as the WBCA journal and World Class Coaching and his Mental Skills and Toughness Training Workshops were featured on ESPN, and at the 2007 NCAA Final Four. Spencer has two undergraduate degrees as well as a Masters Degree in Exercise Science from California University. He is a NASM-PES & NSCA-CSCS exercise specialist and is a PHD (ABD) in motivational psychology with an emphasis on sport psychology. Spencer is the President of Icebox Athlete – a leading provider of Mental Skills/Toughness Training programs that championship athletes, coaches and professionals across the United States have used with distinction.



### John Carter

NOAH Basketball

John Carter is the CEO of Noah Basketball—a leader in Basketball Shooting Technology and Shooting Research. John was instrumental in the development of the Noah Select Shooting System that is now being used by top High School, College, and NBA teams to improve their shooting. He has worked with thousands of players at all levels of the game and has become an authority on how to improve shooting percentages. He speaks at numerous coaching clinics each year sharing with coaches significant unknown facts about shooting. He also served as an AAU basketball coach for many years with over an 80% winning percentage.

## 2009—2010 BOYS' COACHES OF THE YEAR

### Chris Johnson

#### District I - Homestead

Coach Chris Johnson, a 1988 graduate of Ball State University, is in his 11th season as the head coach at Homestead High School in Fort Wayne. The 2009-2010 season has marked his 16th season overall. Prior to his arrival at Homestead, Coach Johnson served as head coach at Fort Wayne Bishop Dwenger from 1994 thru 1999. During his tenure, Coach Johnson has won four conference championships, three sectionals, and one regional. Prior to becoming a head coach, Johnson worked with two fantastic head coaches in Paul Frye at Elder High School in Cincinnati, Ohio from 1989-1992 and Jim East at Merrillville High School in Merrillville, Indiana from 1992-1994. While as an assistant under these two great coaches, Coach Johnson was a part of three sectional and two regional championships. Coach Johnson is also fortunate to gain knowledge and ideas from his brother, Mark Johnson, head coach at South Bend Riley who has won over 300 games and multiple sectional and regional championships. Heading into the 2010 sectionals, the Spartans were 17-4. Coach Johnson has an overall record of 224-128.



### Eric Thompson

#### District I - Peru

After one year at LaVille High School, Thompson has spent the past eight years at Peru. His teams are recognized for how hard they play and compete. Peru has been Mid-Indiana Conference Champion in both 2006 and 2010 and Sectional Champions in 2008 and 2009. This past season Thompson led Peru to a 19-2 record and finished fourth state-wide in defensive average (40.26 PPG). Coach, you had a great year.



### Brian Barber

#### District II - Danville

Coach Barber began his varsity coaching career at Riverton Parke before moving to Danville for the past 11 seasons. He has led his teams to a winning season every year (14) as head coach. His teams have won eight conference, three sectionals, two Hendricks County and one regional title. His career coaching record is 224-90. Congratulations coach, you have had a great career.



### Steve Lynch

#### District II - Mt. Vernon (Fortville)

Steve Lynch just completed his fourth season at Mt. Vernon High School at Fortville. Lynch has accumulated a 59-28 record during his tenure with the Marauders. He has coached at the high school and collegiate level over the past 18 years. The Marauders have won the last two Hoosier Heritage Conference Championships, were the 2009 City Securities Hall of Fame Champions, and finished the season ranked 5th in the IBCA all class poll. Coach, congratulations on a successful season.

### Dave Benter

#### District III - Brownstown Central

Coach Benter recently concluded his 12th season at Brownstown Central where his teams have gone 191-95. During his 12 years, Brownstown has had nine straight winning seasons, won four sectionals, two regionals, two semistates, and has won four Mid-Southern Conference championships. The current Braves were 24-0 after 2010 sectional play.



### Matt Wadsworth

#### District III - North Posey

Matt Wadsworth is a 2002 Southern Illinois graduate. While at SIU, Wadsworth served as student manager for head coach, Bruce Weber and his assistants, current Purdue coach Matt Painter and current University of Southern Indiana coach Rodney Watson.

Wadsworth's coaching career began with the guidance of Bill Bowen at Hamilton Heights High School. He has also served as the boys' varsity coach at Riverton Parke High School. This season, in his second year as coach of North Posey, he led the Vikings to the most victories in a single season 18-2. He has a two year 27-14 won-loss record at North Posey. Coach, congratulations on a great season.



## 2009—2010 GIRLS' COACHES OF THE YEAR

### Jerry Hoover

#### District I - Logansport

Jerry has over 40 years of coaching experience at the high school and college levels. He is the only coach in Indiana high school history to turn losing programs into winning programs at seven different schools. They include Ben Davis, Lake Central, North Judson and Salem. This past season he led the Logansport girls' team to two Holiday Tournament Championships and a 21-2 record. For the past 22 years Hoover has been the Director of the D 1 Camps that have grown from 80 players in the first year to over 3500 today. Congratulations Jerry on a successful career.

### Gene Johnson

#### District I - Jimtown

Coach Johnson is a 1976 Ball State graduate. He has been a head girls' coach for 28 years. Before that he was the boys' JV coach at Jimtown for four years. The Jimmies have won five straight NSC Conference Championships. In 2007 the Jimmies were state runner-up and regional runner-up in 2008. The past four years Coach Johnson has led the Jimmies to an 81-12 record. During the past three years, a span of 66 games, the Jimmies have led the state in scoring defense giving up on 29.2 points per game. Coach Johnson will speak on the high flex offense.



### Kurt Ogden

#### District II - Hamilton Heights

In 1985 Coach Ogden began his coaching career as the seventh grade boys' basketball coach at Tipton High School. During the 1994-95 basketball season he was on Hall of Fame coach Larry Angle's staff as the JV coach before becoming the varsity girls' coach in 1997. After four sectional runner-up finishes, he led the Tipton girls to a regional championship during the 2000-2001 season. In 2006, Ogden became the girls' coach at Hamilton Heights and has led the Huskies to two conference championships. This past season Hamilton Heights won the Huntington North Holiday Tournament, was sectional runner-up and finished the season 20-2, a school record. Great job, Coach!



### Jason Snyder

#### District II - Kokomo

Coach Snyder played his high school basketball at Kokomo for Basil Mawbey. He has been the Kokomo Girls' basketball head coach for the past four seasons. In those years he has compiled a record of 52-27, winning two North Central Conferences Championships, a 4A sectional championship and making one Elite 8 appearance. He has had seven girls receive college basketball scholarships and his teams have earned the reputation for being a hard working, blue collar type team that plays physical and aggressive defense. Congratulations coach, for another outstanding season.



### Melissa Marlow

#### District III - Rushville

Melissa Marlow recently completed her 10th season as head basketball coach at Rushville Consolidated High School. Her career record is 137-97. The 2009-2010 team finished the season ranked #1 in the ICGSA 3A poll as well as #5 in the IBCA single class poll. Their final record overall was 25-3. In her 10 years, the Lady Lions have six sectionals and two regionals. Her teams have also won three Hoosier Heritage Conference Championships. Melissa currently serves as a District 3 Representative on the IBCA Board of Directors and will be the head coach for the 2010 Indiana All Stars against Kentucky. Coach, good luck leading the Indiana girls' All Stars against Kentucky.



### Joe Voelker

#### District III - Floyd Central

Joe Voelker has been the varsity Girls' Basketball Coach at Floyd Central High School in Floyds Knobs, Indiana for the past eight seasons. With his direction the team twice set school records for victories in a season winning 20 games in 2008-2009 and then 25 in 2009-2010. He has coached three Hoosier Basketball Top-40 players during his time at Floyd Central and won sectional and regional titles in 2010. He is also the career wins' leader for Floyd Central girls' basketball with 116. During his 15 year varsity coaching career Voelker is 251-134. Congratulations Coach. You have had a successful career.

### Stu Swartz

#### District I

Receiving sports' media recognition is nothing new to Goshen News sportswriter Stu Swartz. A graduate of Goshen High School, Swartz began his sportswriting career covering Goshen High School baseball while still a junior in high school. He eventually studied at Iowa State University, and then served in the U. S. Army for 11 months. For nearly three decades Swartz has covered the Goshen area sports scene. Among the previous awards' won by Stu are the following-Distinguished Service Award from Indiana Athletic Administration Association in 1996, media honors award from the Indiana Football Coaches Association, district media honors from the Indiana Baseball Coaches. The RRR has had over 2.2 million visitors since its inception and continues to serve as a valuable recruiting resource for college coaches at all levels around the country. 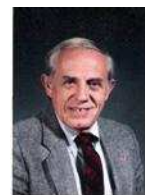
## IBCA/IHSAA BOYS' AND GIRLS' BASKETBALL TOP 100 SHOWCASE

#### District II

Coach Siegel is from New Albany where he was a member of the 1950 Final Four team. He was a four year basketball letterman at Franklin College before beginning a 33 year coaching career. He spent 25 years as varsity basketball coach at Pike High School, leading the Red Devils to 458 wins and 22 team championships. During his career Coach Siegel received 14 different Coaches of the Year Awards and was inducted into the Indiana Basketball Hall of Fame in 1997. During his career Coach Siegel has served on the IBCA Board, was president of the IBCA in 1980 and for 15 years served as the IBCA Coaches Poll Coordinator. Since 1980 he also has served as IBCA Clinic Director during Saturday morning sessions. Coach Siegel retired from coaching in 1995, served on the Indiana basketball Hall of Fame Board of Directors and he is presently Director Emeritus. Coach Siegel continues to give back to the game by serving as Chairman of several Hall of Fame Committees. Congratulations coach and thanks for everything.



### Hugh Schaefer

#### District III

Hugh graduated from Freelandville High School, Oakland City University and Indiana State University.
